

Approved Programs of Study - Qualifications for Registration

Note: National Law refers to the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act as in force in each state and territory

The following lists provide details of the programs of study and qualifications that are accepted by the Podiatry Board of Australia (Board) for:

- general registration as a podiatrist
- registration as a podiatric surgeon
- endorsement of registration for scheduled medicines

The lists include programs of study that have transitioned under the National Law as an approved program of study and have not been accredited by the Board's accreditation authority, the Australian and New Zealand Podiatry Accreditation Council (ANZPAC). Some of the programs of study that transitioned under the National Law are no longer offered by the education provider, but will still be accepted for the purpose of registration or endorsement for scheduled medicines.
