This template has been developed to assist you to record your continuing professional development (CPD) activities. The information in this template should be read in conjunction with the Board's:

- Continuing professional development registration standard, which can be found on the <u>Board's website</u>, and
- Continuing professional development guidelines, which can be found on the Board's website

You may wish to use another format to record your CPD activities.

As well as recording your CPD activities, you must retain evidence of your CPD activities for at least five years from the date you completed the CPD, such as:

- certificates of attainment / attendance
- notes from self-directed CPD activity such as a literature review, case study or journal articles. It is expected that the notes provide a comprehensive summary of the key points of the review and reflect the learning from the activity
- evidence of your training in CPR or advanced life support.

Podiatrists and podiatric surgeons* – Annual requirement: minimum of 20 hours of CPD which must:

- a. include a range of activities from the five categories
- b. include a minimum of five hours in an interactive setting with other practitioners, such as face to-face education Face-to-face education can include technologies that enable interaction such as Skype or videoconferencing



c. have a focus on aspects of podiatry practice that are relevant to your area of professional practice and have clear learning aims and objectives that meet your requirements.
